

# DEFENSE COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

**REQUEST:** Fully fund DCIP at the authorized level of \$100M for FY23.

Our military relies on a complex network of roads, buildings, facilities, utilities and land—on and off-base—to provide the critical training and power-projection platforms needed to protect our nation.

Authorized under Public Law 115-232 Section 2861, the Defense Community Infrastructure Program (DCIP) allows DOD to work with state and local governments by providing a matching grant to address the critical off-base infrastructure needs that have a direct impact on the military value and resilience of our installations.

During the FY20 and 21 Congress appropriated \$50M and \$60M respectively, barely over half of the full authorized amount. But even at this reduced funding level, DOD received an additional \$114M in matching funds from defense communities.

A total of 19 grants were awarded to communities from across the country for broad range of infrastructure projects ranging from airport runway improvements, shoreline erosion protection, groundwater and wastewater system upgrades to youth STEM education centers, fitness and recreation complexes, emergency response stations and early childcare development centers.

These 19 projects demonstrate how effective this program can be, and the demand far exceeds the current funding. During the past two years nearly 200 communities submitted project proposals which would have provided DOD with an additional \$1.6B in matching funds. By funding this program to the fully authorized amount DOD can address more of the critical infrastructure challenges it faces and leverage community investments.

## FISCAL YEAR 2021 & 2022 DCIP GRANT AWARDEES

### Fort Riley, KS

- ▶ Runway Reconstruction for Manhattan Regional Airport

\$5,925,150 to the City of Manhattan, Kansas to undertake a \$6,729,187 project to reconstruct a runway at Manhattan Regional Airport for Fort Riley, Kansas. The project will support military use of the local civilian aviation facility.

### Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek-Fort Story, VA

- ▶ Shoreline and Infrastructure Protection Measures

\$650,000 to Carteret County, North Carolina to undertake a \$1,950,000 project to implement shoreline & infrastructure protection measures on Radio Island. The project will carry out shoreline and infrastructure protection measures on Radio Island. The project supports Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek-Fort Story, Virginia, and will include restoration of a beach and dune system to mitigate erosion problems.

### **March Air Reserve Base, CA**

▶ Groundwater Resiliency Connection

\$4,329,268 to Western Municipal Water District to undertake a \$12,457,527 project to build a local groundwater resiliency connection to support March Air Reserve Base.

### **Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, CA**

▶ Fire Station to Support Emergency Response

\$3,500,000 to the City of Oceanside, California to undertake a \$18,601,703 project to construct a new fire station to support emergency response resources provided to Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton.

### **Minot Air Force Base, ND**

▶ Flood Risk Management System

\$9,840,892 to the City of Minot, North Dakota to undertake a \$23,618,141 project to undertake a portion of a flood risk management system along the Mouse River in support of Minot Air Force Base.

### **Naval Air Station Patuxent River, MD**

▶ Pedestrian Access Project

\$395,118 to St. Mary's County, Maryland to undertake a \$564,454 project to improve pedestrian access across Route 235 to installation gates, supporting Naval Air Station Patuxent River.

### **Naval Air Station Pensacola, FL**

▶ Construction of Offshore Reef Breakwaters and Beach Habitat

\$6,440,985 to Escambia County, Florida to undertake an \$9,201,408 project to construct emergent and submerged offshore reef breakwaters and twenty acres of sandy beach habitat in support of Naval Air Station Pensacola.

### **Naval Air Station Whiting Field, FL**

▶ Wastewater Treatment Capacity

\$3,000,000 to the City of Milton, Florida to undertake a \$4,371,500 project to increase wastewater treatment capacity in support of Naval Air Station Whiting Field.

### **Naval Base Kitsap, WA**

▶ Sewer Replacement Project

\$10,000,000 to the Kitsap County Sewer Utility to undertake a \$20,300,000 sewer main replacement in support of Naval Base Kitsap (Bangor & Keyport).

### **Naval Base Ventura County, CA**

▶ Water Treatment Facility

\$4,230,133 to United Water Conservation District to undertake a \$12,429,191 project to construct a treatment facility for three existing lower aquifer system wells in support of Naval Base Ventura County.

### **Naval Station Everett, WA**

▶ Marina Facilities Support

\$5,254,800 to the Port of Everett, Washington to undertake an \$8,758,000 project to support the Port of Everett's marina facilities in support of Naval Station Everett.

### **Naval Support Activity Hampton Roads – Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, VA**

#### ▶ Transportation Improvements

\$250,000 to the City of Portsmouth, Virginia to undertake a \$640,000 in transportation improvements to Naval Support Activity Hampton Road's Naval Medical Center Portsmouth.

### **Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, OH**

#### ▶ Support to the National Advanced Air Mobility Center of Excellence

\$6,000,000 to the City of Springfield, Ohio to undertake an \$8,019,535 project to support the National Advanced Air Mobility Center of Excellence (NAAMCE) at Springfield-Beckley Municipal Airport. The facility will be used by the Air Force Research Laboratory and Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

### **Dyess Air Force Base, TX**

#### ▶ STEM Complex

\$959,831 to the Abilene Independent School District, Abilene, TX, to undertake a \$1,919,662 project to provide a Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) classroom and laboratory to support military families at Dyess Air Force Base.

### **Ellsworth Air Force Base, SD**

#### ▶ Recreation and Wellness Center

\$6,312,950 to the South Dakota Ellsworth Development Authority, Ellsworth, SD, to undertake a \$12,625,900 project to construct an indoor recreation facility and wellness center to support the military families at Ellsworth Air Force Base.

### **Fort Drum, NY**

#### ▶ Watertown Family YMCA Community and Aquatics Center

\$9,000,000 to the Jefferson County Industrial Development Agency, Watertown, NY, to undertake a \$18,100,000 project to construct a Watertown Family YMCA Community and Aquatics Center to support military families at Fort Drum.

### **Fort Huachuca, AZ**

#### ▶ Emergency Medical Services Substation

\$1,438,000 to the City of Sierra Vista, AZ, to undertake a \$1,538,000 project to construct an Emergency Medical Services substation to support the military families at Fort Huachuca.

### **Fort Irwin National Training Center, CA**

#### ▶ Silver Valley USD Sports Complex

\$521,695 to the Silver Valley Unified School District, Barstow, CA, to undertake a project to enhance the Silver Valley Unified School District Sports Complex to support military families the Fort Irwin National Training Center.

### **Fort Leonard Wood, MO**

#### ▶ Early Childhood Center

\$677,238 to the Waynesville R-VI School District, Waynesville, MO, to undertake a \$1,354,475 project to enhance the Early Childhood Center to support military families at Fort Leonard Wood.

### **Fort Polk, LA**

▶ **Campus Connections and Learning Space**

\$6,839,476 to the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, Baton Rouge, LA, to undertake a \$7,599,418 project in partnership with the Vernon Parish School Board to construct Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics (STEAM) laboratory and learning spaces at Leesville Junior High School, Leesville High School, Pickering Elementary School, and Vernon Middle School to support military families at Fort Polk.

### **Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling, DC**

▶ **Learn D.C. Charter School**

\$1,494,216 to the Lawndale Educational and Regional Network, Washington, D.C., to undertake a \$2,988,432 project to improve access to a Pre-Kindergarten-8th Grade Charter School to support military families at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling.

### **Joint Base Langley-Eustis, VA**

▶ **Air Power Park Tidal Flooding Mitigation**

\$707,008 to the City of Hampton, VA, to undertake a \$1,858,022 project to enhance Hampton's Air Power Park and Museum and provide year-round access to museum grounds to support military families at Joint Base Langley-Eustis.

### **Joint Forces on Guam, GU**

▶ **Multipurpose Recreation and Emergency Center**

\$3,506,426 to the Municipality of Chalan Pago-Ordot, Guam, to undertake a \$6,506,426 project to construct a Multipurpose Recreation and Emergency Center to support military families on Guam.

### **Joint Region Marianas, MP**

▶ **Infrastructure Upgrades**

\$335,000 to the Commonwealth Bureau of Military Affairs, Tinian, Commonwealth of Northern Marianas Islands, to enhance utility infrastructure in support of life, health, and safety for service members rotating on/off the island of Tinian from Joint Region Marianas.

### **Malmstrom Air Force Base, MT**

▶ **Aim High – Big Sky Recreation Center**

\$10,000,000 to the City of Great Falls, MT, to undertake a \$20,000,266 project to construct the Aim High – Big Sky Recreation Center to support the military families at Malmstrom Air Force Base.

### **Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, NC**

▶ **Reconstruction of the Jack Amyette Recreation Center**

\$1,000,000 to the City of Jacksonville, NC, to undertake a \$5,000,000 project to reconstruct the Jack Amyette Recreation Center to support the military families at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune.

### **Marine Corps Base Quantico, VA**

▶ **Fitness Challenge Course and Accessibility Improvements**

\$250,000 to the County of Prince William, VA, to undertake a \$500,000 project to enhance a warrior challenge course with accessibility improvements to support the military families at Marine Corps Base Quantico.

### **Minot Air Force Base, ND**

▶ Magic City Discovery Center

\$6,293,820 to the City of Minot, ND, to undertake an \$13,977,964 project to construct the Magic City Discovery Center, featuring Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) to support the military families at Minot Air Force Base.

### **Mountain Home Air Force Base, ID**

▶ Facility Upgrades

\$426,500 to the Mountain Home School District, Mountain Home, ID, to undertake a project to enhance East Elementary School, North Elementary School, West Elementary School, Hacker Middle School, and Mountain Home Junior High School to support the military families at Mountain Home Air Force Base.
